A Right Relationship

(John 15:7) If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you.

There are times when our prayers are answered, and we seem "in tune" with God. At other times, our prayers seem not to be answered, and we seem far from God. Jesus gives us two directives to keep in mind as we ponder our prayer.

First, we are to abide in Him. This abiding, among other things, includes fostering a conscious awareness of His presence at all times and bringing all thoughts, attitudes, and actions in line with what we understand of His teachings.

Second, "and My words abide in you" will involve studying, memorizing, and meditating upon the Word so that we pray intelligently, knowing God's will ahead of time on some things. As we grow in these two areas, more and more of our prayers will be answered.

Let my mouth be filled with thy praise and with thy honour all the day. (Psa. 71:8)

But I will hope continually, and will yet praise thee more and more. (15) My mouth shall shew forth thy righteousness and thy salvation all the day; for I know not the numbers thereof. (16) I will go in the strength of the Lord GOD: I will make mention of thy righteousness, even of thine only. (Psa. 71:14-16)

God Is Good

God is good, even when life says He isn't. When we face trouble or hardship, it should be seen as an opportunity to rely on God for strength and

endurance. If we can trust him with our pain, confusion, or loneliness, we will win a spiritual victory. God never promised to make our lives easy, but he did promise to be with us and to make our faith strong through our trials.

Of Abraham it is said, "He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief; but was strong in faith, giving glory to God." (Rom. 4:20)

Peter also reminds us that there is some benefit to our trials. "Wherein ye greatly rejoice, though now for a season, if need be, ye are in heaviness through manifold temptations: (7) That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ:" (1 Peter 1:6-7)
